THE PROTECTION OF ANIMALS BETWEEN LAW AND HEALTH

The law journal *Diritto e salute* aims to host an interdisciplinary debate on the most current issues relating to the protection of animals, whether companion, wild, or farm animals. To foster this debate, the journal invites scholars and researchers to submit original contributions related to the following areas of inquiry:

- The legal status of animals: reflections on the concept of subjectivity between *res* and personhood;
- The relationship between animal protection and the right to human health;
- The protection of companion animals and their relationship with humans;
- The protection and control of wildlife;
- The protection of farm animal welfare between human health and sustainability;
- Animal testing and eugenics;
- Family law and animal protection, including aspects related to inheritance law;
- Legal issues surrounding the sale of animals;
- Veterinary medical liability;
- Zoonoses;
- Safeguarding animal health in insurance policies;
- The animal trade market: regulation and protection;
- Ethical finance and animal protection: new tools for a sustainable economy.

Those interested are invited to submit an abstract (maximum 2,000 characters including spaces), in English, Italian, or Spanish, along with their personal information, to the following email address: **redazione.dirittoesalute@gmail.com**. The abstract should briefly outline the key issues that the author intends to address in their scientific contribution.

The deadline for submitting abstracts is **June 15, 2025**. The outcome of the evaluation process will be communicated by **June 30, 2025**.

Selected proposals may be developed into full essays, to be submitted to the journal by **October 30, 2025** at the latest.

Once peer review is complete, the selected articles will be published in one or
